Role Expectations and Holiday

This is a **fixed term contract** which will run until the **30th of May 2025**.

0.8 FTE is the equivalent of 4 days per week during term time (33 weeks of the year) and a degree of flexibility is offered to candidates around timing of delivery of the role on the cyclical basis of the school's delivery of its curriculum. This is an onsite role with some hybrid working required. 21 weeks of holiday is offered across the year to employees, taken outside of term time.
